Halam Church of England Primary School Sports Premium Grant 2020-2021

Financial Year 2020-2021: Sports Premium Funding received £16,870

Despite the huge disruption caused by the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, including periods of school and class closure, and the cancellation of numerous planned events, Halam Church of England Primary School still provided quality first teaching in PE as well as additional opportunities through extra-curricular clubs and visiting sports coaches.

Sports provision at Halam Church of England Primary School 2020 – 2021: Key achievements

- All children have received a minimum of 2 hours of PE per week. This was delivered by both class teachers and specialist sports coaches.
- Sports Coach worked alongside staff on a weekly basis to improve PE lessons and develop staff knowledge.
- Sports coaches provided weekly PE challenge videos and activity cards whilst remote learning
- Daily "get active" sessions by Teams at the beginning each day whist remote learning
- Membership of Newark & Sherwood Sports Partnership
- N&SSP sent out weekly PE planning and activities used whilst teaching in bubbles and maintaining social distancing in PE
- Extra-curricular clubs in Football and multi-sports and for pupils
- PE leader attending subject leader training

 - increase range of active play resources for children to use at playtimes
